The Illinois Law Enforcement Training & Standards Board (ILETSB) has established mandated training requirements for Illinois Peace Officers. Such training equates to 30 hours within a three-year period. Calibre Press, with over 40 years of state-of-the-art, up-to-date research training has created a specifically designed 16-hour course that specifically addresses most of the subject matters required by the ILETSB.
