This updated 80-hour course delivers the fundamental skills new and experienced first-line supervisors, who have not completed formal supervisory training, need to be successful. PSR21C focuses on the role and functions of the first-line supervisor, and builds a rock-solid introduction to management-level decision-making.

PSR21C is designed against the backdrop of current challenges in policing to provide a leadership foundation for the upwardly mobile supervisor. PSR21C consists of two one-week (40 hours per week), in-person, classroom sessions led by Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute instructors, supplemented by reading and writing assignments.
