2. Review and discuss the following 4th Amendment cases:
 - a. Arizona v Grant
 - b. Terry v Ohio
 - c. Kansas v Glover
 - d. Pennsylvania v Mimms, 434 U.S. 106 (1977)
 - e. Maryland v Wilson, 519 U.S. 408 (1997)
3. Identify the fundamental concepts and principles of initiating a stop.

4. Demonstrate tactics for squad car placement and use of lighting for optimal cover.
5. Demonstrate tactics for safely approaching the violator vehicle and returning to squad car.
6. Identify and demonstrate contact and cover options.
7. Demonstrate best practices for de-escalating emotional and non-compliant occupants.
8. Demonstrate tactics for High-Risk Traffic Stops in scenario/role play, proper de-escalation, officer safety techniques for conducting High-Risk Traffic Stops.
